
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IN WEEK 2 OF OUR SUMMER

CAMP, we partnered with Athletes in Action to lead a dynamic sports camp and Bible lessons through skits and small group sessions. That Friday, I sat on the gym floor with all the children, who were sitting in rows, some on their knees, filled with excitement, waiting to hear their names called.

Athletes in Action concluded the week with a celebration called the "Line of Champions," recognizing each child's unique qualities. Leaders lined up, called each child by name and presented them with creative awards, like "Endless Effort," "Iron Man," "Most Electric Player," "Gentle

Giant," "World Cup Wonder," "Best Listener," and "Kindness." Each child walked the line of champions, highfived, and cheered on by their leaders. The gym's atmosphere was electric and the joy on each face was priceless.

A StatsCan report notes that 7 in 10 youth experience some form of bullying, impacting both their mental and physical health. At UPT, we are committed to creating a safe and supportive environment for every child. I overheard one of our leaders telling a youth "For every put-down you say, you have to say ten put-ups." Positive reinforcement combats bullying and fosters a culture of kindness.

Scripture reminds us, "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing" (1 Thessalonians 5:11). As we encourage and build up our children, and StreetLeaders, we see the impact. It builds resilience, confidence and points them to faith in Christ during challenges.

Thank you for encouraging our team as it spurs us on. We couldn't do this work without your support. I pray that the stories in this newsletter will be inspiring to you.

—Jermaine (a.k.a "Juice"), Ministry Supervisor at Camp Victory, and a small team took part in a summer sailing program. Here's what he had to say:

This year, nine Youth Making A Difference (YMADs), five StreetLeaders, and I sailed on Lake Ontario, a new experience for all 15 of us. As we approached the lake, the reality of what

lay ahead began to unsettle many of us; some had never been on a boat, and some couldn't swim. We shared our fears with the experienced sailors guiding us and we prayed together, asking God to help us overcome our fears. We sailed for about two hours and by the time we returned, everyone had enjoyed the experience and was no longer afraid.

This reminded me of Matthew 8:23-27, where Jesus calmed a storm after being awoken from a peaceful sleep by panicking disciples. Jesus' response was a simple question: "Why are you afraid, O you of little faith?" Just like the disciples, we let fear overwhelm us, but by sharing our concerns and relying on God's strength, we found the courage to face those fears and gained an incredible new experience as a result. We learned

that while fear is a natural response, God can always be trusted. Thanks to Broad Reach Canada for this experience.

Q: How long have you been a part of UrbanPromise Toronto, and what drew you to the StreetLeader role?

A: I've been with UrbanPromise Toronto for two years now. I was drawn to the StreetLeader role because it offered the chance to build meaningful relationships—not just with other leaders, but with the kids in my community. Living in the same neighbourhood, it's heartwarming to see how the kids recognize me outside of camp, whether at the park or around the neighborhood. It truly feels like we're all part of a family.

Q: Can you share a challenging moment you faced during camp this year, and how you overcame it?

A: One challenging moment occurred when the kids were restless after being indoors for an extended period. Understanding how difficult it can be to stay inside for too long, I decided to take them outside for some free time. This change in environment helped them release energy and return to our activities more focused and calm. It reminded me of the importance of being adaptable and responsive to the needs of the children.

Q: Was there a moment this summer that inspired you?

A: I was particularly inspired by our WordUP sessions. As the weeks went on, I watched the kids engage more deeply with what they were learning. Seeing their understanding grow and witnessing the joy they found in these lessons was incredibly rewarding. It reminded me of Proverbs 22:6: "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old, he will not depart from it." Being part of their spiritual and personal growth is what makes this role so fulfilling.

Q: What is your hope for the children and youth you lead?

A: My hope for the kids is that they continue to build relationships that extend beyond their immediate circles. I want them to see the value in forming new friendships and experiencing different aspects of life which will help them grow into well-rounded, compassionate individuals who can positively impact their communities.




