

At the event, I shared a powerful story about Justin, who began attending our programs at age 5. Life at home was not normal—his mother struggled with a drug addiction, and he experienced things no child should. But while at camp, life was normal, he found love, joy, fun, and safety. When he was 12, he moved away, and we lost contact.

At 25, after hitting rock bottom, Justin remembered his time at UPT—especially the love and care from his camp leaders. He opened a Bible that his camp leader had given him and started reading it for the first time. God's love leapt off the pages. Longing for that love again and experiencing what he had at UPT, he joined a church, got saved, baptized, and is now serving.

Justin's story is a powerful reminder that God's fingerprints, through the actions, words of others, can leave a mark that endures.

I am reminded of 1 John 4:19. "We love because He first loved us." As we are impacted by Jesus' love, we, in turn, love others out of the abundance of grace and love we received.

This summer, we are excited about raising incredible StreetLeaders to reach 150 children with the love of Jesus in simple and fun ways that will impact them beyond what we can imagine.

My name is Jessica, and I am the Ministry Supervisor for the Kids Program at Camp Hope. As we wrap up the academic year, I am thankful to God for all the ways He has been blessing the kids through our afterschool program. For example, one new family of four children has recently joined Camp. This family is a single-parent-led household that was referred to us by another agency. The parent is a believer, but it can

be difficult for her to meet all her children's needs on her own. God has allowed us to minister to this family by welcoming them to our community, helping the mother with food assistance through Second Harvest, and also providing academic support for the kids. Most of all, we have been able to participate in the children's spiritual development by sharing the gospel with them regularly, and also by praying with them as they learn to communicate with the Lord.

"Painting with Purpose" – A conversation with Achim Fontinelle (Camp Name - Sketch)

From hesitant StreetLeader to artistic visionary, Achim shares how faith, creativity, and community transformed his journey at UrbanPromise.


Q1: When did you first become a StreetLeader, and how did that experience shape you? I got employed as a StreetLeader about six years ago through Chris (Then Community Director). I didn't realize it at the time, but that was the beginning of my journey toward truly getting to know God. At first, I was quiet and introverted, and the role pushed me way outside my comfort zone — leading children, being high-energy, stepping up in ways I never imagined. But over time, I began to embrace it, and with each day, I grew in confidence, leadership, and my walk of faith.

**Q2:** What's your passion, and how did that come alive during March Break? Art has always been my thing — drawing, painting, creating. I saw the March Break micro grant as a chance to bring something special to camp. Instead of just painting on paper, we painted on everything — shoes, shirts, even random objects! I wanted it to be wild, fun, and memorable. And the kids? They absolutely ran with it. They weren't afraid to try new things — they went all in.

**Q3:** How did the kids respond to the painting **project?** It was amazing. I watched them light up as they got creative — asking questions, trying new ideas, and cheering each other on. There was no fear of "not being good enough." Everyone's art had value. That's what made it powerful — it wasn't about perfect technique; it was about expression and freedom. That's the kind of space I always want to create.



Q4: What were some of the challenges you faced leading this initiative? One big challenge was helping the 50 plus kids understand why this mattered. I knew the impact creativity could have, but getting them to see that — to really understand it — took effort. I also had to work on time management



**Q5:** How has UrbanPromise shaped your faith journey? Before UrbanPromise, I knew *about* God — but not God *Himself*. Church was just routine. It wasn't until I joined this program that I heard about having a personal relationship with God. That idea felt foreign at first, but over time — through UrbanPromise staff mentorship, Bible studies, and just being part of this community — it became real. UrbanPromise planted seeds that I still carry today. My walk with God is still growing, and it's not easy, but now it's personal.
